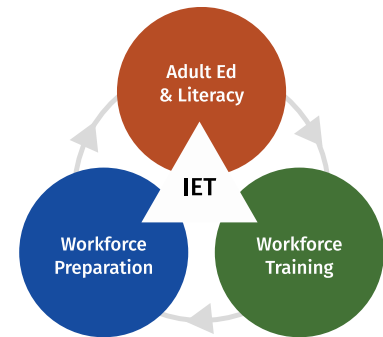




Integrated Education and Training (IET) is an evidence-based workforce development and career pathways strategy that offers workforce training, adult education and literacy, and workforce preparation skills at the same time.

In an IET program, instructors teach adults the academic and workforce skills they need **concurrently** and **contextually** to **accelerate learning** and prepare them for employment after release.



Benefits of IET



Increases access to workforce training programs



Teaches transferrable skills



Aligns with viable career pathways in the community

Key Considerations for Jail Administrators

Consider the following questions for designing and implementing successful IET programs in jails.



How will your facility ensure that IET programs **connect with career pathways** in the community?



How will your facility ensure that IET students are connected with the supports they need to be **successful after release**?



With limited time and space, **when and where** will your facility offer an IET program?



How will your facility **recruit** enough interested and eligible students to participate?



How can you **leverage the success** of the IET program to secure additional funding and in-kind resources and build awareness from partners such as employers?



How can you incorporate **student voices and successes** into communications and outreach?



What **technology** is available and/or needed to deliver the IET program?



How will technology be used to strengthen students' **digital literacy skills**?
