Dialogue A

Dialogue C

Julie: Are there any side effects if I take this medication?

Pharmacist: Some people have a hard time sleeping when they take this medicine. If you can't sleep, call your doctor.

Julie: I understand. If I can't sleep, I should call the doctor.
