

Julie Asks About Side Effects

Directions: Listen to the dialogues. Then practice the dialogues with a partner.

Julie is getting a new prescription filled at the pharmacy. She talks to the pharmacist about the medication.

Dialogue A

- Julie:** What are the side effects for this medication?
- Pharmacist:** This medication can make you feel like vomiting. If you vomit, then you should stop taking this medication and call your doctor.
- Julie:** OK. If I vomit, I'll stop taking the medication. I'll call my doctor.
- Pharmacist:** That's right.

Dialogue B

- Julie:** What are the side effects for this medication?
- Pharmacist:** Some people are allergic to it. If you start to get a skin rash, call your doctor.
- Julie:** OK. If I get a rash, I'll call my doctor.
- Pharmacist:** Right.

Dialogue C

- Julie:** Are there any side effects if I take this medication?
- Pharmacist:** Some people have a hard time sleeping when they take this medicine. If you can't sleep, call your doctor.
- Julie:** I understand. If I can't sleep, I should call the doctor.
- Pharmacist:** That's right.
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
